Message from our Pastor

One of the things I have been doing is cleaning house (for a lack of a better word). Council Meeting Minutes

March 19, 2024

- **Call to Order:** President Jim Day called to order the regular meeting of the Mount Olive Lutheran Church Council at 7:00 pm on March 19, 2024, in the Lakeview Room.
- **In Attendance:** Jim Day, Colleen Klatt, Susan Leifer, Pastor Craig, Herb Anderson, Athena Conway, Karol Falsetti, Mike Flesher, Hannah Joy, Butch Shaffer and Ernie Swanson.
- Devotions and Opening Prayer: Pastor Craig led us in opening prayer. Mike Flesher shared a devotion.
- Additions to the Agenda: Jim Day called for any additions or changes to the agenda. Butch Shaffer moved to accept the agenda as presented. Karol Falsetti seconded. Motion carried.
- **Minutes from the Last Meeting:** Jim Day called for any corrections or additions to the February 20, 2024, minutes. Hearing none, Colleen Klatt moved to accept the minutes as written. Butch Shaffer seconded. Motion carried.

Correspondence: None.

- **Financials:** Treasurer Colleen Klatt presented the financial reports for February 2024. Adjustments were made to the December 2023 financials due to accounting discrepancies for rental income and FY2023 statements are final, showing a net income of \$35,074. February 2024 showed a net loss of \$16,432 largely due to the annual property insurance payment that is due each February. General offerings for the month, however, were up approximately \$7500 over last year. Susan Leifer moved to approve the financials as presented. Mike Flesher seconded.
- **Coffee with the Council Update:** Herb Anderson received comments from many winter visitors. They feel our church is welcoming, provides many fellowship opportunities, many options for music and like the fact that Pastor Craig makes the gospel relatable and that he does not preach from the pulpit.
- **Consent Agenda:** Butch Shaffer moved to approve the consent agenda with the following reports received: Family Fellowship, Outreach, Planned Giving and Endowment, and Worship. Herb Anderson seconded. Motion carried.

Unfinished Business:

Survey Task Force: Tabled.

- <u>New Pictorial Directory</u>: Butch Shaffer presented three options. 1. Colorcraft takes photos and produces the directory. 2. We take photos in-house and Colorcraft produces the directory. 3. We take photos and design/produce the directory ourselves. The topic will be tabled and opened up for discussion again in the fall.
- <u>2023 Post to Capital Reserves</u>: Colleen Klatt moved to post 2023 Net Income of \$35,074.44 to Capital Reserves. Butch Shaffer seconded. Motion carried.

Council Meeting Minutes

March 19, 2024

Synod Assembly Delegates: Pastor Craig reported that the delegates for the 2023 Synod Assembly are – Renee Jennings, Shelly Hales and Butch and Betty Shaffer. Early registration for the gathering is April 15th.

New Business:

- Easter Pancake Breakfast: Council members and the Outreach committee are responsible for set-up, serving and clean up. The Dewey family will be responsible for shopping and food preparation. Outreach should plan on decorating on Saturday afternoon. Hannah Joy will recruit Youth to help on Sunday.
- Council Member Alternate: Craig Medhaug has resigned from Council. Per the constitution, Council can appoint a replacement to serve out the remainder of his term ending in December of 2025. Colleen Klatt moved to approach the 2024 nominees in the order of votes received to see if they are still willing to serve. Jim Day seconded. Motion carried. Jim Day will be responsible for reaching out to the respective members.
- <u>Rental Property Accounting Correction:</u> Because of the confusion that arose from the transition to the new property management company, Colleen Klatt suggested that the rental income/expense accounts be further subdivided between rents, security deposits and expenses. She will present her proposal at a future Council meeting.
- **Call to the Congregation:** Plans for the upcoming Easter breakfast were discussed. Wanda Shockley will email information, instructions and times/dates to all Council and Outreach Committee members. Pastor Craig noted that the Boy Scout troop we support is under Mount Olive's charter and their bank account has our name on it. We may want to begin to monitor it periodically.

Walk on Items: Jim Day noted that due to last year's schedule change for the annual Congregational meetings, it would be necessary to call a special meeting prior to December 2024 to approve the nominating committee for the 2025 Council member election to be held at the December 2024 annual meeting. In lieu of another special meeting for that sole purpose, Jim Day moved that the existing nominating committee that was approved for the 2024 Council member election be called upon to secure nominees for the 2025 Council member election and that a new nominating committee for the 2026 Council member election be voted on and approved at the December 2024 annual Congregational meeting. Colleen Klatt seconded. Motion carried.

Motion to Adjourn: Butch Shaffer moved to adjourn. Colleen Klatt seconded. Motion carried. President Jim Day adjourned the meeting at 8:16 p.m. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.
