# Message from our Pastor

I thought it would be good to give all a refresher on the message that was given on Christmas Eve and Christmas day. One of the thoughts I spoke about, was the cause and effect of "the Word becoming flesh and living among us, full of grace and truth." I said that, "because of Jesus, our lives are irrevocably changed and transformed, because God's love touched our lives with a love that will never end." I also quoted Frederick Buechner who wrote, "The birth of Jesus made possible not just a new way of understanding life, but a new way of living it."

As I reflect back on my life of faith, it has been a series of "cause and effect" encounters with more people than I can count, who have been touched by the love God, through the love and grace of Jesus in their lives. Because their lives were touched and changed by that love, it made it possible for them to give witness to God's love in Christ to me. Many of those encounters, were "thin places", they were glimpses, they were simple gestures. Christ's love touched my life through others, through the extension of empathy or a word of encouragement. I experienced the love of Christ through wisdom and through the stories of faith and life lived by others as they discerned God's presence in their lives.

Relationships have been birthed, grown and matured because of the reality of Christ's love in our lives. I am grateful for the people I have had the privilege to sojourn with on this grace filled life. In the Christmas message I stated, "I am grateful for all the people who have been touched by this love story of Jesus, who because of Jesus, 'took on a new way of living life'. Those people touched my life with their witness, so that I could experience those 'thin places' where God's love was revealed to me." Because of their lives and their witness, the love story of God was planted in my life and in my heart and it found a home in me.

I also quoted Frederick Buechner, where he wrote, "Once we have seen Him in a stable, we cannot be sure where He will appear or to what lengths He will go or to what ludicrous depths of self-humiliation He will descend in His wild pursuit of humankind." I believe this means at least two things. 1) Jesus can come to us anywhere, and we should be receptive to those unexpected and surprising ways, places and people where we see and experience Jesus. 2) It means, God's pursuit and God's love for us is relentless. God will never stop pursuing us and never stop loving us.

Thoughts for reflection and pondering, as we heard in the nativity story. "Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart."

Looking forward to seeing several more of our winter visitors, who will be joining us in January. We normally see a nice—increase in worship over the months of January, February and March. The Women of Winter gathering will be coming around soon, so pay attention to that opportunity.

### November 15, 2022

Absent: Pastor Craig

**Call to order** Meeting called to order @7PM with prayer. Jim shared devotion. Before proceeding with meeting, Colleen shared an announcement on behalf of the Fellowship Committee. They want to hold <u>Find Your Place Do Your Part</u> event (same as last year) **after the late service** on **Jan 22**. Council liaisons should tell their boards and committees to be present.

### II. Standing Agenda Items:

- A. Shelly made motion to adopt agenda and Butch seconded. Agenda approved.
- **B.** Butch made motion to approve minutes from 10/18/22. Kris seconded. All in favor.
- C. Correspondence: none to report
- **D. Financial Report:** For the last month we were "in the black" but for the year we are still over budget by \$13,335.18. Kris asked if Columbarium account had been moved to the bank where the rest of our funds are. Jim Day said not yet. Mary made motion to approve financial report. Shelly seconded. Passed.
- E. Coffee with Council feedback: One member shared they wanted more Psalms read.
- **F.** <u>Consent Agenda:</u> Reports from Property, PGE, Christian Ed., Network Table, Outreach and **W**orship **B**oard. **WB** report pulled for council approval of new summer worship schedule. Kris made motion to approve consent agenda with one report pulled. Colleen seconded. Consent Agenda passed.

Jim made motion to have 1 service on Sunday at 9AM, a blend of traditional and contemporary, during June, July and August. Shelly seconded. Brief discussion about 1 service on Sunday being tried before with grumbling from members. It is not good stewardship to run electricity for a service that only 15 people attend. Motion passed.

### III. Unfinished Business:

- **A**. Fundraising Policy: Butch made motion to accept final draft of fundraising policy included in this month's packet. Karol seconded. Policy passed.
- **B.** White Burro Sale: Leslie has been recruiting people to assist. Shelly will tell her to get her fundraising form turned in for approval ASAP.

C. <u>Budget</u>: Shelly read motion from Executive Committee meeting. Recommendation is that our benevolences be 8% with the contingency that this 8% can be decreased at council's discretion if we are not meeting income expectations according to the budget. Members wanted to know if 8% could be increased when/if income increases. Janet made motion to amend Exe. Comm. recommendation to read: Benevolences will be 8% with contingency that council can ADJUST the % based on not meeting or exceeding budgeted income. Mary seconded motion. Vote on amended recommendation approved by all. Budget will be presented to congregation at the semi-annual meeting Dec. 4<sup>th</sup>.

### IV. New Business:

<u>Youth fundraiser</u>: Jil Ada was present to ask for approval of Spaghetti Dinner on Jan. 28<sup>th</sup> from 4PM to 7PM. Jim presented her application as dictated by new policy. This fundraiser was approved by all.

Rental houses: Jim explained that cost of upkeep on 2 properties (Acoma and corner of Clark) has increased. Our property management company said we could be getting \$1,500. It is our intentional mission to keep rent low for these houses. Jim made motion to increase the rent by \$50 on these 2 properties. Shelly seconded motion. Majority ruled with 1 no vote.

**V. Call to congregation:** Some people have said they miss the music that was played while they enter the sanctuary. A suggestion was made to play recorded music.

VI. Adjourn: Mary made motion to adjourn and Karol seconded. Meeting adjourned with Lord's Prayer at 8:00PM
