#### **Council Meeting Minutes**

#### November 21, 2023

**Call to Order:** President Shelly Hales called to order the regular meeting of the Mount Olive Lutheran Church Council at 7:02 pm on November 21, 2023, in the Lakeview Room.

**In Attendance:** Shelly Hales, Jim Day, Colleen Klatt, Susan Leifer, Pastor Craig, Karol Falsetti, Mike Flesher, Mary Hawkins, Hannah Joy, Kris Kidder, Craig Medhaug and Ernie Swanson.

Devotions and Opening Prayer: Pastor Craig led us in opening prayer. Karol Falsetti shared a devotion.

Additions to the Agenda: Shelly Hales called for any additions or changes to the agenda. Pastor Craig asked to add a discussion of a radio station banner request to New Business. Kris Kidder asked to add a discussion of employee scholarship benefits to Unfinished Business. Colleen moved to accept the modified agenda. Mary Hawkins seconded. Motion carried.

Minutes from the Last Meeting: Shelly Hales called for any corrections or additions to the October 17, 2023, minutes. Hearing none, Jim Day moved to accept the minutes as written. Kris Kidder seconded. Motion carried. Shelly Hales then called for approval of the October 26, 2023, Executive Board minutes. Colleen Klatt moved to approve. Susan Leifer seconded. Motion carried.

Correspondence: Mount Olive received an invitation to the Faith & Grace fundraiser to be held on December 5<sup>th</sup>.

**Financials:** Colleen Klatt presented the financial reports for October 2023. Net income for the month was \$8,630.58. Year to date net income totaled \$20,229.21. Ernie Swanson moved to accept the reports. Mike Flesher seconded. Motion carried. Colleen also made mention of the current CD rates which are paying significantly more than what we receive on our existing accounts. A motion was made for Jim Day and Susan Leifer to research and report back to council for a vote no later than December 15<sup>th</sup>. Mary Hawkins seconded. Motion carried.

#### Coffee with the Council Update: None.

Consent Agenda: Susan Leifer asked to pull the Program Communications Manager report. Pastor Craig asked to pull the Pastor's report. Jim Day moved to approve the modified Consent agenda with the following reports received: Christian Education, Family Fellowship, Outreach, Pastor's Report, Program Communications Manager, Property and Worship. Colleen Klatt seconded. Motion carried. Susan Leifer suggested that a graph with 24 months of data be provided for the metrics reported by the Programs Communication Manager rather than a list of numbers. Pastor Craig asked for feedback on the newly adopted Power Church software which is being implemented to help keep people on task. Points made during the discussion will be given to Jenifer Clark to review.

#### **Unfinished Business:**

- <u>Audit Committee:</u> The audit covering the period June 2022 December 2022 is complete. The committee made no recommendations. Colleen Klatt will ensure that the report is signed by herself and the head of the committee. Jim Day moved to approve. Susan Leifer seconded. Motion carried.
- <u>Long Range Planning:</u> Jim Day asked for a list of names of past members, members not attending, and non-members to ask to take part in the survey for additional data to be presented to Council.
- <u>Window for Front Office:</u> The process has been delayed as the original contractor is unable to complete the installation. Jim Day has asked a member of the wood shop to volunteer. An update will be provided at the next meeting.
- Nominating Committee: These are the seven individuals running for Council: Shelly Hales, Karol Falsetti, Steve Philo, Jerry Govoni, Herb Anderson, Butch Shaffer and Athena Conway as the youth representative.

#### **Council Meeting Minutes**

#### November 21, 2023

<u>2024 Budget</u>: Colleen Klatt, representing the Executive Committee, moved to accept the proposed 2024 Budget to be presented at the Annual Congregational meeting on December 3, 2023. Mary Hawkins seconded. Motion carried.

Employee Scholarship Benefit: Kris Kidder led the discussion regarding the proposed benefit presented at the October Council meeting. Colleen Klatt will meet with the Personnel Committee in January to make further recommendations as discussed, and report back at the January 2024 Council meeting.

#### **New Business:**

<u>List of Current Members:</u> Betty Christenberry has contacted all individuals who are no longer actively attending church to see if they would like to continue as members. Jim day presented the list of people who have either asked to be removed, have not responded or whose contact information is no longer available. Jim Day moved to have the people on the list removed from the current membership roll. Ernie Swanson seconded. Motion carried.

Rental Property Management Company: Jim Day reported several issues that have occurred since our current management company was bought by Home River Group. In addition, our former, long-time property manager has resigned and moved to Lake Havasu City Property Management. Rents for our three properties had been increased without our expressed approval. Jim Day asked to move the management of our properties over to Lake Havasu City Property Management and to establish a rent of \$850.00 per month for all three properties. Mike Flesher moved to approve. Mary Hawkins seconded. Motion carried.

<u>Flag/Banner in Lakeview Room</u>: Jim Day asked for permission to hang a flag and banner for the Lions Club in the Lakeview Room. The group currently sets up and removes them at each meeting. After discussion Jim Day moved to accept the proposal. Craig Medhaug seconded. Motion carried.

Radio Station Banner: Pastor Craig was approached by Murphy Broadcasting asking for permission to hang a banner in our parking lot to advertise the station. The consensus of the Council was a resounding, "No".

**Call to the Congregation:** Wanda Shockley reminded everyone to get their annual reports submitted so the packet can be made available in the Narthex this weekend, ahead of the Congregational meeting.

A question was raised regarding the audit of Restricted Funds. Colleen Klatt stated that there is no specific audit of any particular fund. It is a general audit of receipts and expenditures by the Church.

It was suggested that we review Roberts Rules of Order at a future meeting. The suggestion was noted.

Walk on Items: The parking lot will be painted/striped on Monday, November 27<sup>th</sup>.

**Motion to Adjourn:** Karol Falsetti moved to adjourn. Kris Kidder seconded. Motion carried. President Shelly Hales adjourned the meeting at 8:57p.m. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.
