Changing directions and subject matter: A few things you should know. The church council is adopting a new fundraising policy. So, if you have intentions of hosting any kind of fundraising event you will need to stop by the church office and pick up an application form and have it returned to the office for the council to review and consider, a minimum of 30 days prior to the event and 5 days prior to the council meeting in which the application is to be reviewed. The council meets the third Tuesday of each month. It is highly recommended that you consider having the application in 60 days prior to the event, for a proper approval timeline. We also ask that the (Donee) or recipient of the raised funds be identified. It helps with the PR aspect of promoting the fundraiser.

One of the other realities we face, with some of the ramifications and effects from the pandemic, is a lessening of the revenue stream for the general operating budget. We are usually in "the red" this time of year, <u>but normally, not to this extent</u>. End of September 2022 we were in "the red" a little over \$17,000. **Transparency is our best practice, we simply want to keep you informed and in the know.** We want to encourage you to consider some of the giving options that are available to you even if you are not attending in person on a regular basis. The best options are electronic giving through our website, or an automatic withdrawal from your bank account with a bank check or electronic fund transfer through Vanco Services. Check with Wanda in the church office if you have questions on how you can have some of these options set up. We now, also have, a bar code scan that can be accessed with your cellphone. Jen and Wanda can help you with that as well. Of course, good old snail mail still works, as well as, dropping off your offerings at the church office.

Lots of things coming up: **Fall Holiday Boutique** with all proceeds going to the local food bank. Still need lots of volunteers for set up, and for the days of the sale. **Trunk or Treat** on October 31. Consider bringing your car and handing out goodies to the young people. The **semi-annual Quilt Sale**, and **Woodworkers Sale**, **Fall Fun Fair** at Rotary Park, **Cribbage Tournament** and of course, **Thanksgiving Day** with family gatherings. Kim and I are looking forward to this day, especially, as it will be a family affair for us this year.

I. Call to order Meeting was called to order at 7:01PM. Pastor Craig shared prayer and Mike gave devotions.

II. Standing Agenda Items:

A. Kris asked to add to New Business Arizona Sonshine Free Health Clinic. Butch made motion to adopt agenda with changes. Karol seconded. Agenda approved.

B. Kris moved to approve July meeting minutes. Janet seconded. Minutes approved.

C. Correspondence: none to report

D. <u>Financial Report:</u> Steve shared that income continues to be 6% - 9% under budget each month. July's income figures were lower because deposit wasn't done until August 1. He gave a brief review of our mortgage payment including extra paid towards principal.

- 1. Budget worksheets for 2023 will be distributed Sept 10th.
- 2. He predicts employee benefits package will increase 3%.

E. <u>Coffee with Council feedback:</u> Kris said there are some concerns over doing live streaming. This could be a reason giving is down. People are wondering if the council has talked about ways to get people back in church. Use the van to pick people up. A concern was raised if anyone is doing home communion. Some say the hymns at the traditional service are unfamiliar. All concerns were acknowledged by members.

F. <u>Consent Agenda</u>: Reports from Event Coordinator, Pastor, Family Fellowship, Outreach, Network Table and Christian Ed. Kris and Shelly requested Network Table Report be pulled for further review. Shelly made motion to accept Consent Agenda as amended. Butch seconded. Passed

Kris reported more specifics about the progress on the 3 priority needs at Guiding Light Child Care Center. She showed pictures of the 10 completed windows that Advantage Glass installed and the playground Fall Zone areas. There has been great progress since last month! The teacher who needs the dental work has made contact with the dentist Jim suggested. Jim made comments about increasing fund raising efforts beyond money raised from MOLC activities. There needs to be more effort made to reach out to the community for donations.

III. Unfinished Business:

Fund Raising Policy: Jim stated members should review the draft he gave everyone copies of and email him with any concerns or changes. Form is straight forward asking for who is requesting the event, the date, purpose and location. This must be filled out for every fund raiser and be submitted for council approval a month in advance.
The \$2000 given to Arizona Children's Assoc. from the Burro Sale has been returned. Steve made contact with the committee and they are in favor of donating the money to Network Table. Jim cautioned NOT spending this money before other fund raising is done so that it can be used, if needed, after getting money from other sources. Shelly made a motion to approve giving money to Network Table. Mary seconded. Motion carried.

IV. New Business:

- **Plumbing:** in the new building has been a property issue for 2 years. There were leaks fixed in 2020 and 2021 Kenan Supply sent reimbursement for faulty pipe. Hot water lines in the ceiling still have recurring leaks. All documentation has been saved and submitted. Manufacturer has responded in a timely manner. These pipes are accessible.
- **Music Personnel:** Bryant submitted a letter of resignation as choir director. He wants to continue doing accompanying. A new job description has been created for just choir director. There is a person interested in the position. A weekly salary will be set. Karol made motion to hire choir director and Mike seconded. Motion passed.
- **Arizona Sonshine:** Kris handed out flyers and explained the free health clinic sponsored by Seventh-day Adventist Church. This is the first time this event has been done in Havasu. She plans to volunteer.
