- **Call to Order:** President Shelly Hales called to order the regular meeting of the Mount Olive Lutheran Church Council at 6:59 pm on August 15, 2023 in the Lakeview Room.
- **In Attendance:** Shelly Hales, Colleen Klatt, Susan Leifer, Pastor Craig, Karol Falsetti, Mike Flesher, Hannah Joy, Kris Kidder and Craig Medhaug.
- Devotions and Opening Prayer: Pastor Craig led us in opening prayer. Kris Kidder shared a devotion.
- Additions to the Agenda: Shelly Hales added discussion of our Scholarship policy to New Business and called for any additional changes to the agenda. Hearing none, Karol Falsetti moved to accept the agenda as amended. Colleen Klatt seconded. Motion carried.
- **Minutes from the Last Meeting:** Shelly Hales called for any corrections or additions to the July 18, 2023 minutes. Hearing none, Kris Kidder moved to accept the minutes as written. Mike Flesher seconded. Motion carried.
- **Correspondence:** Kris Kidder circulated cards congratulating Kevin Jackson and Sharon Harvey on their employment service anniversaries for Council signatures.
- **Financials:** Colleen Klatt presented the financial reports for July 2023. Income for the month was higher than in past months, mostly due to a few a-typical, larger donations to the local offering. Expenses ran consistent with prior months. YTD our net income is \$23,048.00 versus an approximate \$21,000.00 loss YTD July of 2022. Shelly Hales moved to accept the reports as presented. Kris Kidder seconded. Motion carried.

Coffee with the Council Update: There was no Coffee with Council in August.

**Consent Agenda:** Shelly Hales moved to accept the consent agenda with the following reports received: Outreach, Pastor's Report, Planned Giving & Endowment, Program & Communications Manager and Property. Karol Falsetti seconded. Motion carried.

## **Unfinished Business:**

<u>Audit Committee:</u> The first meeting was held Tuesday, August 15<sup>th</sup>. Judy Thomas, Lenny Hart-Hawkins and Patricia Haslam were in attendance. There is nothing more to report at this time.

<u>Long Range Planning</u>: Shelly Hales developed a list of approximately twenty five names of potential committee members for the up-coming survey task force. She will email the list to Council members for consideration.

## Window for Front Office: Tabled.

- <u>By-Laws Change:</u> The letter announcing the Sept. 17<sup>th</sup> special meeting was placed in the Olive Branch and in the Church bulletin.
- Nominating Committee: Proposed list of committee members are as follows: Lil Aston, Shelly Hales, Kris Kidder, Leighton Kidder and Helen Williams. Karol Falsetti moved to accept the proposal. Colleen Klatt seconded. Motion carried. The committee member proposal will be brought for a vote at the special meeting to be held Sept. 17<sup>th</sup>.

## New Business:

- <u>Café & Music Room Floor Care</u>: Pastor Craig reported that three bids to strip and wax the floors had been received. All three were over the budgeted amount of \$1,000.00. The bids will be submitted to the property committee for their consideration.
- <u>Scholarship Policy</u>: A member of our congregation has asked for help with tuition and books to pursue a two-year associate degree which would ultimately lead to a Bachelor of Science degree in ministry. We have two funds available however; the requirements to obtain assistance from these funds fall outside this type of request. After discussion the council proposed to form a committee to look into potentially broadening the criteria for access to these funds. Shelly Hales will ask Jim Day to chair the committee and bring a policy proposal to Council.

## Call to the Congregation:

Some members are wondering why the blinds are always closed in the sanctuary. Questions about the condition of the parking lot striping were raised along with asking if there were plans to complete the re-surfacing. It was suggested that we advertise our Bible studies and other Church events in the Daily Happenings section of the News Herald to reach out to the general public.

Walk on Items: Jim Day will lead the next general meeting in September.

**Motion to Adjourn:** Colleen Klatt moved to adjourn. Karol Falsetti seconded. Motion carried. President Shelly Hales adjourned the meeting at 8:10 p.m. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.
