Message from our Pastor

I recently attended the Bishop's Fall Gathering. This is one of the few times throughout the year that fellow clergy have the opportunity to gather together. It is meant to be a time of intentional gathering for mutual support and some much-needed | Sunday down time to simply rest and relax. We also had some excellent presenters who challenged us and gave us some food for thought to reflect upon as we return to our ministry settings.

One of the topics we spent some time listening and reflecting upon is lament. Lament is expressed often throughout scripture perhaps more than we realize. The primary text we reflected upon was the passage of scripture from the Road to Emmaus. Luke 24: 13-35. The verse that expresses lament is vs. 21 and it begins with the words, "but we had hoped" that he would be the one to redeem Israel."

When we think of lament, it is oftentimes associated with something that we grieve or a lost hope or dream. For these disciples walking on the road to Emmaus, they were lamenting the loss of Jesus and all the hopes they had for his life and impact upon them. Lament does oftentimes begin with a statement or a thought that sounds like, "But we had hoped".

I was pleased to have the opportunity to meet Debie Thomas. She is one of the authors and columnists that I have quoted oftentimes in many of my sermons. She was a delight to listen to and I can say without hesitation, her reflections and thoughts did not disappoint. She is a person who is gifted with deep theological reflection and she brings a meditative introspection that challenges and encourages me.

One of the things she reminded us of is, we as a culture and to some extent as a church, we have either lost our ability to lament or we find ways to avoid lament in our lives. She said that one of the reasons why we avoid lament in the life of the church is because we think it will compromise our Christian witness. She suggests that lament is a part of who we are and that if we took the time to express lament, it would actually give us more authenticity in our faith witness.

She also said that culturally, we are moving away from community and connectedness and that has created a "toxic culture of individualism." She would argue and encourage us to move more toward connectedness which would cultivate more of an opportunity for shared grief or shared lament.

She spoke of lament as something that we have a tendency to avoid, because we want to forget. She would contend that grief or lament asks us to remember and that it actually allows the wound of loss to move us on to a healthy place.

Her final point that is worthy of some contemplation and reflection is the idea or the concept that "we are called to embody grief". She asserted that we need to spend more time "paying attention to what our bodies are telling us", especially, in regard to lament and grief. Her caution is, if we lose lament, it can lead to calcification of our hearts and we become numb to grief and suffering. She further cautions us that, "if we will not lament, we will not love."

One of the things she encouraged us to do and we did practice this with a time for self-reflection. She encouraged us to spend some time reflecting upon some of the things or feelings of lament that we have either avoided or ignored or repressed. We simply started with the phrase, "But I had hoped......" and she allowed us time to ponder that and encouraged us to write down some thoughts and reflections.

I found this to be challenging and I was a little apprehensive, but once I started the process, some reflections were brought to light and it was good to bring those reflections to the written page.

She gave us some hope on the other side by suggesting that we allow Jesus "To be our holy editor". To ask ourselves and reflect upon the question, "What story frames your life right now?" She also quoted another author, Daniel Kirk, who suggests, "Good stories begin and end with another." It can lead us to a "holy restlessness."

Take some time to lament, I believe you will find it helpful. Let Jesus into the story and the lament, let him be your holy editor. Perhaps it will lead to a new story or a renewed "holy restlessness."



Council Meeting Minutes

September 19, 2023

Call to Order: Vice President Jim Day called to order the regular meeting of the Mount Olive Lutheran Church Council at 7:00 pm on September 19, 2023 in the Lakeview Room.

In Attendance: Jim Day, Colleen Klatt, Susan Leifer, Pastor Craig, Karol Falsetti, Mike Flesher, Hannah Joy, Kris Kidder and Ernie Swanson.

Devotions and Opening Prayer: Pastor Craig led us in opening prayer. In lieu of devotions, Jim Day took the opportunity to acknowledge the prayer chain and their continued dedication to praying for our members.

Additions to the Agenda: Jim Day moved the Troop 1304 presentation as first on the agenda ahead of general business. Hearing no calls for any additional additions or changes, Colleen Klatt moved to approve. Karol Falsetti seconded. Motion carried.

Minutes from the Last Meeting: Jim Day called for any corrections or additions to the August 15, 2023 minutes. Hearing none, Kris Kidder moved to accept the minutes as written. Colleen Klatt seconded. Motion carried.

Correspondence: Pastor Craig read a note from the Pregnancy Care group thanking the Outreach committee for their continued support and donations of wipes and diapers.

Financials: Colleen Klatt presented the financial reports for August 2023. August showed a loss of almost \$7,000.00 which is "typical" for the summer months. YTD we are showing a net income of slightly over \$16,000.00. Pastor Craig noted that these numbers are an improvement over 2022. Colleen also mentioned that she will start working on the 2024 budget. Kris Kidder moved to accept the reports as presented. Ernie Swanson seconded. Motion carried.

Coffee with the Council Update: There was no Coffee with Council in September.

Consent Agenda: Jim Day moved to accept the consent agenda with the following reports received: Christian Ed, Columbarium, Family Fellowship, Outreach, and Property. Karol Falsetti seconded. Motion carried.

Unfinished Business:

<u>Audit Committee:</u> The next meeting date is to be determined, but the committee is making progress. Jim Day suggested setting a completion date for the audit in time for the December congregational meeting. There is nothing more to report at this time.

<u>Long Range Planning:</u> Oct 14 at 10:00 a.m. has been set aside for members to meet and submit input for what they see as the long-range vision for our Church. A brainstorming session will be held and a list of priorities will be developed at this meeting.

<u>Window for Front Office:</u> The first step will be to open up the drywall inside to assess what needs to be done prior to installing the window.

<u>By-Laws Change:</u> Thank you to Steve Philo for submitting the verbiage for the by-law change. The proposal passed at the congregational meeting held September 17, 2023 and is now in effect. Wanda Shockley will submit the change to the Synod.

Nominating Committee: Lil Aston, Shelly Hales, Kris Kidder, Leighton Kidder and Helen Williams will serve as the 2024 council member nominating committee. The slate of candidates was passed at the congregational meeting held September 17, 2023. Kris Kidder will lead the committee.

<u>Café & Music Room Floor Care</u>: Completed. Pastor Craig will be meeting with the owner of the company on Friday, September 22nd. The application appears to be uneven and hazy in some sections and needs to be corrected. Payment is being withheld until the issue is resolved.

Scholarship Policy: Steve Philo previously emailed council members recommending that no changes be made to the existing scholarship policies, but rather to incorporate education/professional development opportunities into the employee benefits package. This would become a new line item in future budgets. The personnel committee will meet and bring a proposal to council at some point in the future for consideration.

New Business:

<u>Portico Benefits</u>: Colleen Klatt reported that the Portico benefit increase percentages for 2024 were very minimal and moved to continue to offer employees the Gold-Plus benefits package. Susan Leifer seconded. Motion passed.

Troop 1304 Kindness Rock Garden: Representatives from Girl Scout Troop 1304 would like to place a Kindness Rock Garden on the Church campus to satisfy one of the requirements of their Journey/Take Action badge. They would be responsible for maintaining the area. Painted kindness rocks would be placed for individuals to take or to add. Susan Leifer moved to approve the project. Mike Flesher seconded. Motion carried.

<u>Insurance Premium Estimates for Budget</u>: Colleen Klatt will request new quotes from our insurance underwriter and ask Butch Shaffer to investigate other offerings in preparation for the 2024 budget.

<u>Budget Sub-Category Distribution</u>: Colleen Klatt will distribute budget worksheets to committee chairs via email and also place a printed copy in mailboxes in preparation for the 2024 budget.

<u>Quilt Sale Fundraiser</u>: Mike Flesher moved to accept the Quilters fundraiser request as submitted. Hannah Joy seconded. Motion carried.

Call to the Congregation: Two new groups (quilting and square dancing) have submitted requests to use our Church as a meeting place.

Walk on Items: None.

Motion to Adjourn: Kris Kidder moved to adjourn. Karol Falsetti seconded. Motion carried. Vice President Jim Day adjourned the meeting at 7:50 p.m. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.
