It was peaceful and calm.

Council Meeting Minutes

October 18, 2022

Absent: none

I. Call to order: Jim called meeting to order at 7PM. Pastor shared prayer. Butch read an inspiring devotion that explained the meaning of each line in the Holy Spirit Prayer.

II. Standing Agenda Items:

- **A.** <u>Agenda:</u> Jim asked to add White Burro Sale and Balloon Festival as a New Business item. Janet made motion to approve agenda with those additions. Mary seconded. Agenda approved.
- **B.** Minutes: Kris stated the order of some info from last month's meeting should be switched around due to discussion always coming **after** a motion is made (according to Robert's Rules of Order). Motion was made by Kris to accept the minutes with those changes and Colleen seconded. Shelly will make necessary changes. Minutes approved.
- C. Correspondence: none to report
- **D. Financial:** Steve summarized the September General Fund balance (-\$2,308.13) and the YTD balance (YTD -\$20,662.27). He recommended closing the Mission Fund and World Hunger Fund, which have been itemized on the Restricted Fund report, because there has been no income or expenses for at least 3 years. The envelope boxes that were printed for individual members had specific envelopes titled for those funds. We are no longer using those envelopes due to the cost. Mary made a motion to close Mission and World Hunger Funds and remove them from the Restricted Fund Report. Mike seconded. Motion carried. Colleen made a motion to approve the financial report and Karol seconded. Financial report was approved.

Steve passed out Draft #2 of the budget for the next fiscal year directing us to give consideration to how we can lower the benevolences. There needs to be a decrease in money spent in order to have a balanced budget and he feels this is the area to do that. He explained the timeline for the council to approve a budget so that it can be presented for a vote at the December 4th congregational meeting.

<u>Coffee with Council feedback:</u> Butch decided to "go to the people" instead of waiting at a table for people to come to him. He went around to various tables in the café. One idea shared was not doing live streaming hoping to boost attendance in person.

There was a correction to be made on the Nertwork Table Report. The Scoops Fundraiser donations totaled \$535.

III. Unfinished Business:

Corrections on the wording of the **Fundraiser Policy** Permission Form need to be made therefore, this will be tabled for next month.

Van rides: Mike knows of someone from The Views complex who would like a ride to church. Paul should put up a slide or an announcement can be made asking for people to contact the office if they are willing to stop by The Views to pick people up or if anyone who lives there needs a ride.

IV. New Business:

Burro Sale: A chairperson for the next sale needs to be identified. Shelly agreed to talk to Leslie.

Balloon Festival: Jim asked for council's permission to use the MOLC van to help shuttle people to the festival in January. Jim made motion to use the van, with our volunteer drivers, to shuttle people to and from the parking areas. Mike seconded. No discussion. Motion passed.

V. Call to congregation:

Comments: Wanda noted that people who need a meal delivered the day of the Thanksgiving meal should let the office know. She asked for council to spread the word. Last year there wasn't any problem finding volunteers to deliver them. The Dewey family helped!

VI. Closing:

Adjourn: Colleen made motion to adjourn and Karol seconded. Meeting adjourned at 8:05 PM with Lord's Prayer.
