Message from our Pastor

For those who wanted the list from the Thanksgiving Worship or for those who missed it, here is the list. Giving credit where credit is due, this is a list provided by Rev. Shane L. Bishop, Pastor of Christ Church in Fairview Heights, IL. Enjoy.

- 1) Make everyone stay at the table for a full hour. Set a timer. No one leaves. No one. "Are you done eating? Who cares? Sit down." And not a bit of dessert or a sip of coffee for forty-five minutes.
- 2) No phones at the table. None. If you look at your phone, it goes in the turkey carcass with the stuffing until supper. If your phone rings, you are doing dishes. No exceptions. Late violations can carry over to next year.
- 3) Say grace. Old fashioned. Heads bowed, eyes closed, holding hands. Have the patriarch or matriarch do it. Kids are cute. Let old people say grace. One person can keep their eyes open to monitor.
- 4) Remember those by name who are not in their chairs this year. Speak out the names of deceased loved ones. Remember their lives, place in your family and their sacrifice.

- 8) Tell the people around your table just how much you love them and why they are special to you. There are no guarantees they will be here next Thanksgiving. Or you either for that matter.
- 9) Help clean up and stick around. Clear the table. Watch some football. Remember great Thanksgiving football games past! Google Clint Longley. Take a nap. Go on a walk. Drink coffee. Drink more coffee.
- 10) Give thanks. Find a moment to get away, drop to your knees and personally tell God thank you.
- 11) Don't talk politics. If anyone does, construct them a home-made political button denoting the opposite party and touting the name of their least favorite president of all time. Make them wear it all day. No button, no pie.
- 12) Make the best of things. Things will never be "perfect." Take what you have and make the best of it. No matter how things go, at least you are not a turkey.

And from my sermon on November 26, the recommended daily prayer that I suggested we pray on a daily basis. For your consideration and possibly for your daily walk with Jesus.

"Lord make me an instrument of your love. Lord, help me to see you today, **in the places where** I would <u>least expect to see you</u> and **in the people** that I would <u>least expect to see you</u>. Lord, help me <u>to see with your eyes</u>, **feel with your heart** and **love with your love**, because our ability to see with your eyes, feel with your heart and love with your love, only comes from the fact that you loved us first, and that is what makes it possible for us to be little Christ's to one another.


Happy Work Anniversary

Council Meeting Minutes

October 17, 2023

Call to Order: President Shelly Hales called to order the regular meeting of the Mount Olive Lutheran Church Council at 7:01 pm on October 17, 2023, in the Lakeview Room.

In Attendance: Jim Day, Colleen Klatt, Susan Leifer, Pastor Craig, Karol Falsetti, Mike Flesher, Mary Hawkins, Hannah Joy, Kris Kidder, Craig Medhaug and Ernie Swanson.

Devotions and Opening Prayer: Pastor Craig led us in opening prayer. Ernie Swanson shared a devotion.

Additions to the Agenda: Hearing no calls for any additional additions or changes to the agenda, Jim Day moved to approve. Ernie Swanson seconded. Motion carried.

Minutes from the Last Meeting: Shelly Hales called for any corrections or additions to the September 19, 2023, minutes. Hearing none, Jim Day moved to accept the minutes as written. Karol Falsetti seconded. Motion carried.

Correspondence: None.

Financials: Colleen Klatt presented the financial reports for September 2023. Although September 2023 net income of (\$4808.78) was \$2,000 lower than September 2022, net income YTD 2023 of \$11,519.96 is ahead of YTD 2022. Jim Day moved to accept the reports as presented. Mike Flesher seconded. Motion carried.

Coffee with the Council Update: Kris Kidder shared the following concerns brought to her attention: Finish parking lot, complete striping of the parking lot, and the need for a large print bulletin. Wanda Shockley was asked to provide approximately 12 large print bulletins for services.

Consent Agenda: Kris Kidder asked to pull the Personnel Committee report with the following reports received: Christian Education, Family Fellowship, Outreach, Pastor's Report, Program Communications Manager, Property and Worship. Mary Hawkins moved to accept the change to the consent agenda. Colleen Klatt seconded. Motion carried.

The Personnel Committee presented a proposal to increase the stipend for musical accompaniment at memorial services from \$75 to \$100 and weddings from \$75 to \$125. Jim Day moved to approve the increase. Craig Medhaug seconded. Motion carried. Wanda Shockley will make corrections to the pamphlets itemizing these services. Personnel also asked for Council approval for the new employee scholarship benefit proposal to be added to the employee handbook. Jim Day requested that this item be tabled at this time for further discussion. No motion was required. Kris Kidder stated that the employee recognition luncheon was well received.

Unfinished Business:

<u>Audit Committee:</u> Pastor Craig asked to have the audit completed by the next Council meeting for approval prior to the Congregational meeting in December.

<u>Long Range Planning:</u> Input from the October 14 brainstorming session is being compiled. The list of priorities was voted on and the items receiving the top votes will be presented at the next Council meeting. Steps for implementation will be discussed at that time.

Council Meeting Minutes

October 17, 2023

- <u>Window for Front Office:</u> The process of opening the interior drywall to assess what needs to be done prior to installing the window will happen this month.
- Nominating Committee: At this time there are seven individuals who have indicated that they would be interested in running for Council: Shelly Hales, Karol Falsetti, Steve Philo, Naomi Gilbertson, Jerry Govoni, Herb Anderson and Athena Conway as the youth representative.
- <u>Café & Music Room Floor Care</u>: The issue presented at last month's meeting has been resolved and the vendor has been paid.
- Insurance Premium Estimate: After contacting two other carriers, Butch Shaffer recommended that we stay with our current carrier, Guide One, as the total premium was consistent with what the other carriers were able to quote this far in advance. They are expecting an approximate 5-8% increase in our premium for next year and the Church can always switch carriers once a more solid quote becomes available closer to renewal. The premium estimate will be incorporated into the 2024 budget.
- <u>2024 Budget</u>: Colleen Klatt distributed the first draft to be reviewed by the Executive Committee prior to presenting to Council in November.

New Business:

Woodshop Fundraiser: Colleen Klatt moved to approve the request. Mary Hawkins seconded. Motion passed.

<u>Personnel</u>: Renee Jennings reported that the committee has established suggested pay increases on an individual employee basis. These increases considered both performance and inflation. She will present the changes to Colleen Klatt who will incorporate the new wages into the 2024 budget for consideration.

Call to the Congregation: A question was asked about the distribution of funds raised by the Woodshop. Jim Day said there was no formal committee but that the group as a whole decides where the money goes and, per Thrivent guidelines, a certain percentage must go back to the Church.

The new Church Constitution incorporating the By-law passed during the special Congregational meeting has been distributed and the Synod notified.

It was suggested that we invite outside groups using our facility to future Council meetings to share what they do.

Walk on Items: The September Special Congregational Meeting minutes will be presented and approved at the December Congregational Meeting.

Motion to Adjourn: Jim Day moved to adjourn. Shelly Hales seconded. Motion carried. President Shelly Hales adjourned the meeting at 8:14 p.m. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.
