Message from our Pastor

We have just concluded the season of Epiphany. That time in the life of Jesus where God's divine vision, justice and divine intent is revealed to us through Christ. God's divine vision is foreign to the world in many respects because it calls for radical discipleship and an alternative vision for humanity. As most of us realize on a daily basis, God's alternative vision is not an easy path to follow. Regardless of your time in life, whether a youth still discovering who God and Jesus is, or a senior adult, maneuvering the challenges and complexities of aging and health challenges. Each of us is faced with emotional, physical, mental and spiritual challenges and circumstances that test our patience and our baptismal response to living a grace filled life.

Kim and I are certainly in a new chapter of our lives, providing care and monitoring her dad who has new physical challenges. Empathy, patience and compassion are constantly being challenged as we maneuver this new life chapter. Practicing what you preach is not an easy path, especially for me. PASS IT ON

1. Let's say it's 7:25pm and you're going home (alone of course) after an unusually hard day on the job.
2. You're really tired, upset and frustrated.
3. Suddenly you start experiencing severe pain in your chest that starts to drag out into your arm and up into your jaw. You are only about five minutes from the hospital nearest your home.
4. Unfortunately you don't know if you'll be able to make it that far.
5. You have been trained in CPR, but the guy that taught the course did not tell you how to perform it on yourself.
6. **How to survive a heart attack when alone?**
Since many people are alone when they suffer a heart attack without help, the person whose heart is beating improperly and who begins to feel faint, has only about 10 seconds left before losing consciousness.
7. However, these victims can help themselves by coughing repeatedly and very vigorously. A deep breath should be taken before each cough, and the cough must be deep and prolonged, as when producing sputum from deep inside the chest. A breath and a cough must be repeated about every two seconds without let-up until help arrives, or until the heart is felt to be beating normally again.
8. Deep breaths get oxygen into the lungs and coughing movements squeeze the heart and keep the blood circulating. The squeezing pressure on the heart also helps it to regain a normal rhythm. In this way, heart attack victims can improve chances of getting to a hospital.
9. Tell as many other people as possible about this. It could save their lives!!

January 18, 2022

I. Call to order: Meeting was called to order at 7:05 by VP Butch Shaffer. Pastor Craig gave opening prayer and Mikey shared devotions.

Absent: Mary H.

II. Standing Agenda Items

Anonymous gift was added as old business and "phone attended" added under new business. Shelly made motion to accept agenda with additional items and Kris seconded. Motion passed

B. Karol made motion to adopt minutes with a date correction in the name of the file used to save them. Shelly seconded. Minutes approved.

C. Pastor shared that we received a nice thank you note from a person who had recently had the altar flowers delivered to them.

D. Steve indicated he is doing some fine tuning of the books therefore approval is not needed right now. Financial report is as accurate as possible at this time. There is some sorting out of the health insurance to be done due to over billing us. The Food Bank Fund shows a negative balance because an error occurred in the office, resulting in an overpayment of \$3213.82. Pastor made a motion for an unplanned transfer of \$3213.82 from Humanitarian Fund to the Food Bank to cover the error and restore the Food Bank Fund balance back to zero. Steve seconded. Motion passed.

In the past Sunday School has given offering to a fund called the Future Building Fund. This fund has had no action in a long time and should be closed out. Steve made a motion to close out Future Building Fund and return the money back to the SS fund. Kris seconded. All in favor, motion carries.

E. Coffee with Council feedback: Suggestion was made to somehow include the history of our Lutheran hymnals as part of a music performance or service.

F. Consent Agenda: 5 reports submitted. Steve made motion to approve. Janet seconded. Consent Agenda approved. 1. Pastor 2. EC 3. Fellowship 4. Worship Board 5. Outreach

III. Old Business: Covid Update 36% positivity rate

White Burro sale 2/24, 25, 26 : Leslie was pleased that 27 people came to the first planning meeting. Next meeting is Feb. 6 between services. Plan is to start set up early in the week on Sunday the 20th after the coffee café is empty.

Anonymous Gift: Butch reminded us of the \$14,000 gift and asked if council would think about doing another congregational challenge to decrease our mortgage. The last time proved very successful.

IV. New Business:

Sound Booth Equipment: Several microphones have not been working for a long time. Sound Bank has tried to fix the issues. Experts agree we are in need a completely new sound board with more output channels. Kevin Jackson has knowledge to help set it up. Pastor made motion to set aside \$3500 from undesignated memorial funds for purchase of a new sound board. Karol seconded. Motion passed.

Phone attended: Pastor wanted council's input on if our office should be on an automated answering system due to the number of calls Wanda answers that are questions about the Covid testing being done in our back parking lot. After discussion, some were okay with doing it. Others did not agree. No council action is needed at this time.

V. Call to congregation:

Comments: Question was asked about a designated funeral fund. People have asked about giving money to help pay for food when there are refreshments or luncheons done after celebration of life services. Steve indicated the family usually pays and there is a petty cash fund for the purchase of items ahead of time so there doesn't seem to be a need for a separate fund.

VI. Closing: Walk on items: Butch reported his research on the cost of an electronic sign on Havasupai. Cost is between \$28,386 and \$46,000. Pastor stated we need an "in house" form or procedure to thank people for their financial gifts.

Adjourn: Kris made motion to adjourn. Mikey seconded. Meeting adjourned with Lord's Prayer at 8:30PM.
