## Message from our Pastor

One of the things I have come to realize especially in my time in congregational ministry is that people simply want to have someone to talk with. Sometimes we just simply need to have someone who is able to be present with us. To allow ourselves to be vulnerable and allow ourselves the freedom to release whatever it is that we have been holding onto for so long. To let it out and express it through words, tears, and a whole host of emotions that may come with that opportunity to speak it out of ourselves.

All of us, in one form or another have experienced some form of hurt or brokenness in our lives. It can be the loss of a loved one through death. Or it can be the loss of a relationship with a spouse, significant other or even a broken relationship with a parent, a sibling or a friend or co-worker. Sometimes it can be something as traumatic as an abusive relationship that has left some scars. Sometimes we hold or carry those broken or hurtful feelings and emotions over a long period of time.

Other times I find that people simply want to be able to share something about their life situation. Especially persons who are facing significant challenges. I've said this before in a variety of contexts, there are a lot of dislocated people, or persons experiencing homelessness or who are facing a tenuous living situation due to a lot of factors or reasons. Sometimes I find that many of these persons feel less than human or have a sense of unworthiness because of their encounter with law enforcement, the court system or because of the broken relationship itself.

We are called as people of faith and followers of Christ to be compassionate, forgiving and empathetic. The apostle Paul speaks to us about this encouragement in Philippians 2 and he reminds us to, “Have the mind of Christ.” Prior to this he writes, “If therefore, there is any encouragement in Christ, if there is any consolation of love, if there is any fellowship of the Spirit, if any affection and compassion, make my joy complete by being of the same mind, maintaining the same love, united in spirit, intent on one purpose.....with humility of mind let each of you regard one another as more important than yourself; do not merely look out for your own personal interests, but also for the interests of others.”

Have the mind of Christ. I don't know for sure what that really means. What I have come to know about Jesus through out my walk of faith is simply this. Jesus is gracious, he is kind, he has compassion upon people and he knows us better than we know ourselves. Jesus was and is humble, Jesus forgives and his love for you and for me is unconditional. You are beautifully and wondrously made and you are precious in the sight and mind of Christ. Walk in that unconditional love that Jesus has for you. And when possible be the presence of Christ to someone who needs you to be the presence of Christ in their life.

## Council Meeting Minutes

January 16, 2024

**Call to Order:** President Jim Day called to order the regular meeting of the Mount Olive Lutheran Church Council at 7:00 pm on January 16, 2024, in the Lakeview Room.

**In Attendance:** Jim Day, Colleen Klatt, Susan Leifer, Pastor Craig, Herb Anderson, Karol Falsetti, Hannah Joy, Craig Medhaug, Butch Shaffer and Ernie Swanson.

**Devotions and Opening Prayer:** Pastor Craig led us in opening prayer. Colleen Klatt shared a devotion.

**Additions to the Agenda:** Jim Day asked to add Approval for Woodshop Fundraiser to New Business. After the call for other additions to the agenda Ernie Swanson moved to accept the modified agenda. Craig Medhaug seconded. Motion carried.

**Minutes from the Last Meeting:** Jim Day called for any corrections or additions to the December 2023, minutes. Hearing none, Butch Shaffer moved to accept the minutes as written. Colleen Klatt seconded. Motion carried.

**Correspondence:** None.

**Financials:** Colleen Klatt presented the financial reports for Year End 2023. December giving was especially strong, receiving \$48,538. This contributed to the year-end net income figure of \$35,211. Karol Falsetti moved to accept the financials as presented. Butch Shaffer seconded. Motion carried.

**Coffee with the Council Update:** Comments received included holding a weekly woman's fellowship meeting like the men's fellowship held Tuesdays and holding a Church-wide blood drive. Suggestions have been noted.

**Consent Agenda:** Jim Day asked to pull the Planned Giving & Endowment report for discussion. Susan Leifer moved to approve the modified Consent agenda with the following reports received: Family Fellowship, Outreach, Pastor's Report, Personnel Committee, Program Communications Manager, Property and Worship. Butch Shaffer seconded. Motion carried. Jim Day noted that the PG&E decision to give \$1,000 to the food bank with funds donated directly to the Endowment fund was procedurally incorrect. All expenditures from the fund must have Council approval. Pastor Craig asked to move the User-Agreement Revision discussion up from New Business, to be presented first prior to proceeding with Unfinished Business. Jim Day approved the request.

### Unfinished Business:

Survey Task Force: Four questionnaires have been completed and received. Jim Day would like suggestions for 4 more non-members to participate in the survey.

Window for Front Office: The window has arrived and the position for placement has been determined. We will receive another update next month.

Certificate of Deposits: Jim Day and Susan Leifer met with Edward Jones and opened up 175,000 6-month CD a rate of 5.25 percent and an APY of 5.4%.

## Council Meeting Minutes

New Pictorial Directory: Butch Shaffer reported that Lifetouch no longer does Church directories. He is currently looking into other alternatives.

Employee Scholarship Benefit: Jim Day presented the proposed policy for an Employee Scholarship Benefit Offering. Ernie Swanson moved to accept. Butch Shaffer seconded. After discussion, it was suggested that Line 1 of the policy should include the phrase “full time”. Jim Day moved to accept the amended policy. Butch Shaffer seconded. Motion carried.

### **New Business:**

Petty Cash/Credit Card: Pastor Craig reported that our current bank can not issue a credit card to an employee of a non-profit organization, other than the Pastor of a church. He has requested to add Wanda Shockley as an authorized user of his account.

Parish Center Chairs: A member of the congregation requested that the Church purchase new chairs for the Parish Center. Many of the old ones need to be re-upholstered and/or have legs that are bent or scratched. Jim Day would like to know how many of the chairs are unsalvageable before the Council considers a proposal.

E-Giving/Website: Pastor Craig asked for feedback regarding E-giving. Currently, asking for donations is the first thing people see during a live stream. The majority of the Council felt we should continue to encourage giving electronically but should look at ways to make the request more subtle.

User Agreement Revisions: Jen Clarke presented the updated Event/Activity renewal forms for organizations that utilize our facility on a regular basis. The forms would be distributed annually and would help streamline the current process. Butch Shaffer moved to accept the forms as drafted. Craig Medhaug seconded. Motion carried.

Woodshop Fundraiser: The request to hold a fundraiser March 23-24<sup>th</sup> was presented. Butch Shaffer moved to accept. Herb Anderson seconded. Motion carries.

**Call to the Congregation**: Wanda Shockley asked all liaisons to review the contact information for all boards and/or committees and submit any changes to her for updates.

**Walk on Items**: Susan Leifer noted that Christmas Service times/dates were not readily available to the public. She suggested services should be posted each week on Facebook, be more visible on our website and there be a voicemail recording with dates/times for after hours. This is especially important for Easter and Christmas services. Pastor Craig noted that Mount Olive will provide our van for shuttle services during the upcoming Balloon Festival.

**Motion to Adjourn**: Butch Shaffer moved to adjourn. Karol Falsetti seconded. Motion carried. President Jim Day adjourned the meeting at 8:17p.m. The meeting closed with the Lord’s Prayer.
