Message from our Pastor

As a congregation, we are transitioning into our summer mode. Many of our ministry groups and committees temporarily discontinue their activities and meetings. We have a fair amount of membership who take some trips and extended stays to places where the heat is less intense. Worship life takes on a different feel with significantly fewer people in attendance. My suggestion is, let's try and be a bit more community minded when we gather. Sitting in the middle two larger sections would give us a greater sense of community. And our joint singing and worship expression might actually be heard. Just a suggestion. No forced marches.

It is going to be an active summer with a lot of youth activities taking center stage. The mission trip to Puerto Rico is closing in quickly. We are scheduled to leave Las Vegas late on the evening of June 11 and return late on Friday, June 17th. Praying for all to be healthy and Covid free, as we will be testing before we leave. While in Puerto Rico, we will be serving in the city of Arecibo, a smaller city of about 90,000 people. We will be working with a mission trip program called Youthworks. They have been engaged with Puerto Rico since 2003, as they have partnered with several local churches and organizations. We will be engaged in some building projects, food pantry outreach and children's programs. This is a first-time flying adventure for some of our youth and a first-time mission trip for most. Prayers and good thoughts for our anxious youth as they venture off into a new mission adventure. May we learn and be transformed by this gospel experience of sharing the love and compassion of Christ with those we meet, encounter, and work with on this trip.

Council Meeting Minutes

April 19th, 2022

Absent: Kris K.

I. Call to order President Jim Day called meeting to order at 7:00PM. Pastor shared opening prayer then Jeff read his devotion choice.

II. Standing Agenda Items:

A. <u>Agenda</u>: Jim called for additions to agenda. Two items need to be added under new business: Columbarium and Hymns and Hops Fest (sample flyer handed out) Butch made motion to adopt agenda with additional topics. Steve seconded. Agenda was approved.

B. <u>Minutes:</u> Karol made the motion to approve the minutes from last month and Shelly seconded. Minutes for March approved without corrections.

C. Correspondence: Butch shared a thank you note from Faith and Grace.

D. <u>Financial Report</u>: Steve explained that he discovered an error in the 2022 budget. It was previously reported that offerings were down compared to last year. This error caused the figures to appear that way. The \$11,000 insurance bill also effects the bottom line. There is a shortfall in unrestricted funds. The current state of the economy causes some people to put giving as a low priority. Butch made the motion to approve the financial report and Janet seconded. All in favor. Motion carried.

E. Coffee with Council feedback: no report

F. <u>Consent Agenda</u>: Reports were turned in from <u>W</u>orship <u>B</u>oard, Pastor, Outreach, Property Board and our Event Coordinator. Pastor asked to pull the <u>W</u>orship <u>B</u>oard Report. Mary made a motion to accept the Consent Agenda with the WB report pulled for discussion. Butch seconded. Motion passes.

The recommendation from the <u>WB</u> is that we return to some of the traditional practices of passing the plate (starting May 1) and communing at the altar rail (starting June 1). As mentioned at previous meetings, Jim shared he has trouble getting ushers. After some discussion of time needed to get a list of ushers and time needed to train them, Jim made a motion to return to passing of the offering plate on June 1. Karol seconded. Motion passes. Jim also made motion to commune at the rail as of June 1 and Shelly seconded. This motion also passed.

III. Unfinished Business:

- <u>Funds from Burro Sale:</u> Leslie sent a breakdown of what charities the funds will go to with the council packet a week ago. There were questions from Jim, Susan and Shelly regarding how these particular groups were chosen. She said she talked to several people who helped with the sale on the phone or in person. Steve made a motion that she go back and have on official meeting with a committee. Janet seconded. Motion carried.
- Organ Sound: Butch researched ways to increase the sound of the organ. Live Stream viewers have said they can't hear it very well. There isn't an output jack to put a cable into on the organ. He was told the best way to fix the issue is to put a microphone by the speakers. He will continue to research the best way to accomplish this task.

Board and Committee Structure: Steve emailed info to council members about our current structure. We will revisit this.

IV. New Business:

- How to Process Funds for Network Table projects: Steve stated that supporting the Network Table's projects are part of our mission so a restricted fund can be set up specifically for the funds that people choose to donate. These funds can then be given to pay for the priority needs of Guiding Light Christian Education Center.
- Prep for Annual Meeting on May 1: Quick review of what will happen that Sunday. Voting for 4 council members and 1 Planned Giving and Endowment board member. There will be a quick meeting after that with the newly elected council members and all the others to decide officers.

Council Meeting Minutes

April 19th, 2022

Employee Handbook Revisions: Steve reviewed the changes done. Document was shared previously via email. One of the changes includes employee evaluations being done in September yearly. Raises will be based on exceptional performance. Doing this process in September allows the corresponding raise to be included in the next year's budget proposal. Steve made a motion to approve this draft with the addition of gender specific language. Leslie seconded. Motion passed. Record Retention Revisions : Tabled for next meeting.

- Server Workstation Upgrade Proposal: It has been discovered that the new laptop purchased needs more upgrades and all the office workstation software needs upgrading. The cost could reach the \$10,000 limit. The congregation must vote at the May 1 meeting. Steve will put together necessary info. Steve made a motion to seek a congregational vote to approve this expenditure. Leslie seconded. Motion passed.
- <u>Synod Assembly Reps</u>: Pastor indicated this convention is June 10, 11 in the Mesa area. He recommended deciding on the reps to attend this event each year be a standard item on the agenda in February. Jim said he and Judy would go if no one else wanted to. Reps will be decided at the May 1 annual meeting.
- <u>Blind Alley Quote</u>: The best quote for the window covering in the Fireside Room is from Blind Alley. Document was shared via email in packet. Steve made motion to approve \$1500 from the Undesignated Memorial Funds be spent to get this improvement done. Karol seconded. Motion approved.
- <u>Columbarium</u>: There are 80 unsold niches left in the Columbarium Garden. Gary Powers and the board are asking the council to approve money from fundraisers over the summer be designated for additional niches. A visual sample of what they would look like was available to look at. The entire structure is moved in as one unit with a crane. The Dewey's have agreed to do hamburgers and hotdogs for Memorial Day and Fourth of July.
- <u>Hymns and Hops Fest</u>: The Christian Education Board would like council to approve us hosting something similar either on the church campus or at a local brewery. A sample flyer was included in the packet sent out before this meeting. Brief discussion occurred about getting a liquor permit. Council agreed to get further info and revisit this idea.
