#### Message from our Pastor

Happy, July 4<sup>th</sup>!!! We celebrate our freedoms and we remember all those who have given their lives to protect this freedom and we extend a word of gratitude and thanks to all who have selflessly served. With this freedom comes great responsibility for all of us to do justice, walk humbly and do what we can to bless each other in this shared humanity.

July is a month for us to celebrate the young people of our church family. We have a couple of key events coming in the month of July that celebrate, uplift and encourage our youth. We have 13 persons who will be attending camp up at Camp Pinerock, in Prescott, AZ from July 3-7. These are youth ranging in grades 6-12. This is part of the Synod wide camp consortium group known at Campformation. We currently have 13 churches who will be represented at camp from all around Arizona and Nevada.

We will gather for 5 days to enjoy and explore the beauty and the wonder of God's handiwork. It will be a unique experience for many of our youth as many of them come from urban, metropolitan areas. July is also the month when we will be extending an invitation to the entire Lake Havasu City community to join us for 3 days of Vacation Bible School. Once again, a time for youth to refocus and take their minds and their eyes off of all the multiple images, messages and media sources that seem to dominate the lives of our youth today. Three evenings of music, bible stories, crafts, hands on learning and much more. VBS will be held from July 25-27. Starting late afternoon around 5:30 and concluding around 8:30 each evening.

#### A Message from the 2023 Grand Canyon Synod Assembly, From Butch & Betty Shaffer

We have had the pleasure and privilege to represent Mount Olive Lutheran Church at this year's Grand Canyon Synod Assembly, which was held at the Resurrection Lutheran Church in Oro Valley, AZ., on Friday and Saturday, June 9th and 10th. We were warmly welcomed to the beautiful campus and were treated to refreshments and free time to explore and renew or cultivate new friendships. The theme for this years assembly was "Be Bold in Our Baptism."

Friday afternoon opened with worship, a bit of procedural business and then our remarkable keynote speaker Rev. Dr. Anthony Bateza, the Associate Professor of Religion at St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minnesota. He had our attention from word one when the title of his talk displayed on the screens said..."Keep Your Clothes On!" He proceeded to prove what an inspirational story-teller and teacher he could be.

We then recognized congregation milestones and newly ordained ministers. We also celebrated rostered minister anniversaries and retirements. Bishop Deborah Hutterer, who recently visited Mount Olive, was the officiant of the Assembly and kept us on task, on time and always made us feel very welcomed. Our last speaker on Friday was Pastor Sara Cutter, Senior Director of Operational Effectiveness, from Hickory, North Carolina, who was the ELCA churchwide representative at our Assembly. She, too, was an exceptional orator, and we wish our entire congregation could have been there to hear her with us.

Friday evening culminated with a special event hosted at the Tucson Children's Museum, where we ate from HUGE charcuterie boards, enjoyed Sonoran-hot dogs, ice cream treats and beverages, plus we could roam from room to room to be entertained.

Saturday presented us with the opportunity to hear both keynote speakers again, a bit more business to attend to, and then a moving presentation by Sister Angelica (Lika) Marcias, who started an immigration shelter in Nogales, Mexico to temporarily house immigrant families or individuals in legal transition into the United States. Her "Little piece of home" has served over 2,500 people since its inception in 2020, and our Synod is one of four agencies that support this endeavor.

We had a beautiful closing worship ceremony to cap off the Assembly and left feeling Grateful and Determined to be "Bold in Our Baptism."

We realize that a lot of us really do not hear much about the "goings on" of our Synod. We were reminded to forward to our congregations that the Grand Canyon Synod has a website, with endless information. Website is: www.gcsynod.org

#### Thank you, Mount Olive Church Members, for your Support!!

**Network Table** has wrapped up our year and a half support project for **Guiding Light Christian Educational Center**. We thank you; we could not have done it without your support.

#### God is good!

We were able to accomplish more than we could have imagined at the beginning. With the training and support we received from Open Table's Jon Katov and Angie Williams, we were able to provide Guiding Light with new exterior windows and doors, proper fall-zone safety edging for outside play equipment, and critical periodontal work for a valuable staff member.

There are a number of ways to look at the *financial impact* of these projects. Without taking discounts into consideration, the table was able to finance over \$20,000 worth of work for Guiding Light. If the retail value of the work including labor and the time of the table members are included, over **\$40,000** worth of work was provided to Guiding Light. The *real value* of this work allows Guiding Light to focus their time and money on *raising up happy and healthy children* who are part of Lake Havasu's future.

May 16, 2023

**Call to Order:** President Shelly Hales called to order the regular meeting of the Mount Olive Lutheran Church Council at 7:00 pm on May 16, 2023 in the Lakeview Room.

**In Attendance:** Shelly Hales, Jim Day, Colleen Klatt, Susan Leifer, Pastor Craig, Jeff Bodnar Jr., Karol Falsetti, Mary Hawkins, Hannah Joy, Kris Kidder, Craig Medhaug and Ernie Swanson.

**Devotions and Opening Prayer:** Pastor Craig led us in an opening prayer. Colleen read the devotion.

Additions to the Agenda: Prior to the adoption of the agenda, Jim Day took the opportunity to explain the purpose, structure and goals of the meetings for the benefit of new members and answered questions. Shelly Hales then called for any additions to the agenda. Susan Leifer moved to add a discussion of a future date for the installation of new members to New Business. Hannah Joy seconded. Motion carried. Kris Kidder moved to change the Consent Agenda committee description of "Event Coordinator's Report" to "Program & Communications Manager". Colleen Klatt seconded. Motion carried.

**Minutes from the Last Meeting:** Shelly Hales called for any corrections or additions to the April 18, 2023 minutes. Miscellaneous typos were brought to the floor. Jim Day moved to approve the minutes with changes. Colleen Klatt seconded. Motion carried.

**Correspondence:** Jim Day reported that the recurring water-line leaks in the new building will be addressed and covered under the terms of the builder's manufacturer's warranty.

**Financials:** Steve Philo presented the financial reports for April 2023. Net income year to date is below what we would like to see based on years past. Susan Leifer moved to transfer \$50,000 from the Miscellaneous Designated Pass-Through account to Capital Reserves and move \$3,833.85 from the same account to the Humanitarian Fund. Pastor Craig moved to amend the motion to move the entire \$53,963.55 from the Pass-Through account to Capital Reserves. Susan Leifer then moved to change the motion as recommended by Pastor Craig. Jim Day seconded. Motion carried. Kris Kidder moved to accept the financial reports as amended. Jim Day seconded. Motion carried.

**Coffee with the Council Update:** Due to the Annual Meeting, Coffee with Council was not held during the month of May.

**Consent Agenda:** Shelly Hales moved to accept the consent agenda with the following reports being received: Program & Communications Manager, Outreach, Pastor's Report, and Personnel Committee. Jim Day moved to accept. Karol Falsetti seconded. Motion carried.

**Unfinished Business:** 

Audit Committee: Discussion tabled until next month.

<u>Long Range Planning:</u> The facilitator helping us with planning is currently out of the country. Jim Day will speak to them about developing a questionnaire for parishioners to be distributed in the fall of this year. Jim will provide another update at the next meeting.

<u>Sign-Ups for Devotions/Coffee with Council/Committee Liaisons:</u> Sign-up sheets were passed around to Council members for sign-ups.

<u>New By-Law:</u> The Executive Board recommended that only one Congregational Meeting be held each year instead of two. Susan Leifer nominated Steve Philo to address the addition/change to the by-laws and draw up a proposal. Kris Kidder seconded. Motion carried.

<u>Installation of Council Members:</u> Installation of Council members will occur on June 4<sup>th</sup> at all three services. Members are to be at church at 5:00 (Sat), 8:30 and 10:00 (Sun).

**Call to the Congregation:** Wanda Shockley completed her review of all Columbarium records to ensure all names, niche #s, etc. are accounted for and match up accordingly.

As of today, there are 2 niches that have been paid for but do not have a corresponding name or number, and there are a total of 67 niches available.
