Message from our Pastor

We are currently in that period of the summer referred to as the "dog days". It has a reference to the star Sirius, also known as the "Dog Star". During the dog days of summer, the sun occupies the same region of the sky as Sirius, the brightest star visible from any part of the earth. Ancient Romans believed it actually gave off heat and added to the Sun's warmth. Whatever the reason may be, it is definitely hot out there. Just a tidbit of trivia to spark your interest.

One of my favorite songs when I was in my teens was the song "Pass it On". It came to life and was written back in 1969 by Kurt Kaiser. Kurt was collaborating on a musical with Ralph Carmichael. The name of the musical was, "Tell it Like it Is". It was written to get young people involved in the church.

They felt they needed some kind of a closer song (a modern day, "Just as I Am") On a Sunday night after church, Kurt was sitting in his den by the fireplace where there were remnants of a fire, and it occurred to him "it only takes a spark to get a fire going" and the rest came very quickly. It only took about 20 minutes to write the lyrics. It is said that this song, "Pass it On" became the banner song of the Jesus Movement. I have no doubt this is true.

Kurt's greatest thrill came when he saw 100,000 people at the Cotton Bowl singing this song. Kurt remembers that night. "they were lighting candles off one another and the whole place was singing...."It only takes a spark to get a fire going....."

The lyrics to the song are:

It only takes a spark to get a fire going, And soon all those around, can warm up in its glowing, That's how it is with God's love, once you've experienced it You spread His love to everyone, you want to pass it on.

COUNCIL NEWS

Good day to all from your council president,

Our monthly meetings since the May election have been very productive. We have had several significant items on our agenda. The most important is a recommendation we want to share with you. Constitutional guidelines require us to <u>notify the congregation of a special meeting to communicate this council proposal.</u>

On **September 17th,2023** there will be a **special congregational meeting at 11:30 AM**. This meeting will be short, but your attendance is extremely important because your input and vote are crucial.

The purpose of the meeting is to consider a "bylaw change" recommendation from the church council. Current Bylaw; C10.01.01 Bylaw states: "The Congregational Council shall determine the times of regular congregation meetings. This congregation will hold two regular meetings each year; the annual meeting in May for election of officers, and the semi-annual meeting in December for approval of the budget. Additional business may be transacted at these regular meetings when included on the published agenda." (12/6/2020)

Recommended Bylaw change will read as follows: "The Congregational Council shall determine the times of regular congregation meetings. This congregation will hold **one** regular meeting each year; the annual meeting in **December, for election of (church council members) officers and for approval of the budget**. Additional business may be transacted at these regular meetings when included on the published agenda."

The other purpose of the special meeting, (IF the bylaw recommendation passes), is to elect a nominating committee, to prepare a slate of candidates for church council to be voted upon at the December annual meeting.

There will be a vote on the council recommendation. The church's success and growth can only occur when all its members are aware of the upcoming changes.

Council Meeting Minutes

June 20, 2023

Call to Order: President Shelly Hales called to order the regular meeting of the Mount Olive Lutheran Church Council at 7:02 pm on June 20, 2023 in the Lakeview Room.

In Attendance: Shelly Hales, Jim Day, Colleen Klatt, Susan Leifer, Pastor Craig, Jeff Bodnar Jr., Karol Falsetti, Mike Flesher, Mary Hawkins, Hannah Joy, and Craig Medhaug.

Devotions and Opening Prayer: Pastor Craig led us in opening prayer. Shelly Hales shared the devotion.

Additions to the Agenda: Shelly Hales called for any additions to the agenda. Hearing none, Jim Day moved to accept the agenda as presented. Mary Hawkins seconded. Motion carried.

Minutes from the Last Meeting: Shelly Hales called for any corrections or additions to the May 16, 2023 minutes. Jim Day moved to approve the minutes as written. Colleen Klatt seconded. Motion carried.

Correspondence: Two cards congratulating Jesse and Jenifer Clarke on their service anniversaries were circulated for Council signatures.

Financials: Colleen Klatt presented the financial reports for May 2023. She noted that income from April was counted and recorded in May which resulted in a higher than actual reported net income for May. Year to date, we are ahead by a little more than \$10,448. Mike Flesher moved to accept the reports as presented. Craig Medhaug seconded. Motion carried.

Coffee with the Council Update: Susan Leifer gave feedback from June's Coffee with Council. No immediate action items are to be taken, but comments and concerns were noted.

Consent Agenda: Shelly Hales moved to accept the consent agenda with the following reports being received: Family Fellowship, Network Table, Outreach, Pastor's Report, Personnel Committee, Program & Communications Manager and Property. Shelly Hales asked to pull the Network Table report. Pastor Craig asked to pull the Personnel report. Jim Day moved to accept the consent agenda as amended. Colleen Klatt seconded. Motion carried.

Renee Jennings presented the updated personnel job descriptions packet. Colleen Klatt suggested that the job descriptions for Bookkeeper and Treasurer be removed from the packet as these are not paid positions. Shelly Hales moved to accept the job descriptions (with the removal of Bookkeeper and Treasurer) as presented. Mary Hawkins seconded. Motion carried.

Shelly Hales reported that the last meeting of the Network Table occurred on June 14. The loan from the Church has been paid back in full. She requested that the restricted fund line item for the Table be closed, with the balance of \$20.00 moved to the Vacation Bible School (VBS) fund. Susan Leifer moved to close the account and transfer the \$20.00 as suggested. Karol Falsetti seconded. Motion carried.

Unfinished Business:

- <u>Audit Committee:</u> The committee needs one additional member. Colleen Klatt will make the request for a volunteer from the congregation at both services.
- <u>Long Range Planning:</u> Jim day spoke with the facilitator and sent feedback from the April 22nd Council retreat. The next step is to develop a survey to be distributed to the congregation. Anyone interested in being part of the survey task force should contact President Shelly Hales.
- <u>Café Refrigerator:</u> Thank you to Jim Day for his part in obtaining the new refrigerator which is now up and running.
- Window for Front Office: Tabled until the contractor who will do the install is back in town.
- <u>Updated By-Laws:</u> The updated/changed By-law to move to one congregational meeting per year was included in the Council packet. Shelly Hales moved to accept the new By-law as written. Karol Falsetti seconded. Discussion as to how to handle to existing terms of council members followed. Susan Leifer moved to shorten the terms of the outgoing members by 6 months ending in December of 2023 as opposed to extending 6 months ending in December of 2024 to accommodate the new, yearly calendar. Shelly Hales seconded. Motion carried.

Shelly Hales moved to set September 17th as the date for a special congregational meeting to vote on the new By-law. Colleen Klatt seconded. Motion carried.

A nominating committee of five members (2 outgoing council members and 3 members of the congregation) will be named at the upcoming July council meeting to be presented to the congregation for a vote at the September 17th congregational meeting.

New Business:

Remembrance Tree Fundraiser: Jim Day moved to approve the fundraiser as presented in the Council packet. Colleen Klatt seconded. Motion carried.

Call to the Congregation: Wanda Shockley is looking for an updated list of boards/committees and their members. Council liaisons are to provide that information to her by the next meeting.

Individuals watching our live stream commented that for the past few weeks the sound is either of poor quality or non-existent. Shelly Hales will ask Jenifer Clark to investigate.

Walk on Items: None

Motion to Adjourn: Jim Day moved to adjourn. Colleen Klatt seconded. Motion carried. President Shelly Hales adjourned the meeting at 8:13 p.m.
