Message from our Pastor

Recently, I have been reading some excerpts and stories from the Alcoholics Anonymous Big Book. The story that caused me to take a moment to reflect is one in which the person writes, "I read everything I could about this disease. I had access to a good medical library, but after a while, I realized.....All that I need to know about it, what would help me get sober, help me recover, I could learn in A.A."

She further reflected about her experience with the meetings, she wrote, "The slogans on the walls, which at first made me shudder, began to impress me as truths I could live by: 'One Day at a Time.' 'Easy Does It.' 'Keep It Simple." 'Live and Let Live.' 'Let Go and Let God.' 'The Serenity Prayer."

These slogans "began to impress me as truths I could live by." The simple truth is, all we have is the gift of today. There are no guarantees we will be alive tomorrow. As people of faith we live our lives, "by grace through faith," and we trust that our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ leads us in the ways in which we are meant to journey on any particular day through the gift of the Holy Spirit. Our lives are lived, "one day at a time." It goes without saying that we continue to hope, dream and have aspirations for more days and more opportunities to steward our lives, nurture our relationships, be open to future relationships and future service, hospitality, and ministry possibilities. Right now, we have today, with all the opportunities, challenges and blessings that come our way.

The Serenity Prayer certainly helps us to keep our lives and relationships in perspective. "God, grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, the courage to change the things I can and the wisdom to know the difference. Living one day at a time. Accepting hardships as the pathway to peace. Taking, as Jesus did the sinful world as it is, not as I would have it. Trusting that he will make all things right if I surrender to His will; that I may be reasonably happy in this life, and supremely happy with Him forever." Reinhold Niebuhr

The choral music program will be different from years past. The choir will meet and rehearse weekly. This is completely unclear at this time since the Bell Choir is not in session and we do not have a set director for the group.

There will be no guarantee of a special music offering on the 3rd and 4th weekends of each month. That will be determined by the frequency in which people offer their gifts for those worship weekends. It is a new day in the life of the music ministry at Mount Olive Lutheran as we need to work within the limitations of the personnel and music resources (people and instrumental gifts) available to us and the willingness of people to offer their gifts and talents toward our mutual worship expression.

It was written by an 8-year-old named Danny Dutton, who lives in Chula Vista, CA. He wrote it for his thirdgrade homework assignment, to 'explain God.' I wonder if any of us could have done as well? (and he had such an assignment, in California, and someone published it, I guess miracles do happen!)

EXPLANATION OF GOD:

'One of God's main jobs is making people. He makes them to replace the ones that die, so there will be enough people to take care of things on earth. He doesn't make grownups, just babies. I think because they are smaller and easier to make. That way He doesn't have to take up His valuable time teaching them to talk and walk. He can just leave that to mothers and fathers.'

'God's second most important job is listening to prayers an awful lot of this goes on, since some people, like preachers and things, pray at times beside bedtime. God doesn't have time to listen to the radio or TV because of this. Because He hears everything, there must be a terrible lot of noise in His ears, unless He has thought of a way to turn it off.'

'God sees everything and hears everything and is everywhere which keeps Him pretty busy. So, you shouldn't go wasting His time by going over your mom and dad's head asking for something they said you couldn't have.'

'Atheists are people who don't believe in God. I don't think there are any in Chula Vista. At least there aren't any who come to our church.'

'Jesus is God's Son. He used to do all the hard work, like walking on water and performing miracles and trying to teach the people who didn't want to learn about God. They finally got tired of Him preaching to them and they crucified Him. But He was good and kind, like His father, and He told His father that they didn't know what they were doing and to forgive them and God said O.K.' And God did not let Jesus stay in the grave, but raised Him from the dead.

'His dad (God) appreciated everything that He had done and all His hard work on earth so He told Him He didn't have to go out on the road anymore. He could stay in heaven. So, He did. And now He helps His dad out by listening to prayers and seeing things which are important for God to take care of and which ones He can take care of Himself without having to bother God. Like a secretary, only more important.'

'You can pray anytime you want and they are sure to help you because they got it worked out so one of them is on duty all the time.'

'You should always go to church on Sunday because it makes God happy, and if there's anybody you want to make happy, it's God!

Don't skip church to do something you think will be more fun like going to the beach. This is wrong. And besides the sun doesn't come out at the beach until noon anyway.'

'If you don't believe in God, besides being an atheist, you will be very lonely, because your parents can't go everywhere with you, like to camp, but God can. It is good to know He's around you when you're scared, in the dark or when you can't swim and you get thrown into real deep water by big kids.'

'But,.you shouldn't just always think of what God can do for you. I figure God put me here and He can take me back anytime He pleases. And... that's why I believe in God.'

Council Meeting Minutes

July 19th, 2022

Absent: Mikey, Kris, Karol, Butch

I. Call to order Meeting was called to order by Jim Day at 7:00PM. Pastor began meeting with prayer and Janet shared devotions.

II. Standing Agenda Items:

A. Agenda was revised by Jim adding "council orientation" under unfinished business. Shelly made motion to approve agenda with addition. Mike seconded. Motion passed.

B. Mary made motion to approve minutes from June's meeting. Colleen seconded. Minutes approved.

C. Jim read thank you notes that came from Faith and Grace and Havasu Community Health for donations done with White Burro income. He also shared a thank you note from Network Table to the Woodshop for donation to windows project at Guiding Light.

D. Steve presented financial reports. Currently church is spending slightly more than is coming in. He talked with Wanda about decreasing administrative expenses as much as possible. There was discussion about expenses from Synod Assembly being higher than what was budgeted. Jim said we should report the lower income to congregation through bulletins and Pastor Craig's verbal announcements at services. Steve asked for motion to close Sunday School Support Restricted Fund no longer needed as separate line item. Colleen made motion and Mary seconded. Motion passed.

Additional financial updates:

1. Council's Executive Committee decided to use funds from undesignated memorials for the inflatable water slide that Christian Ed. Comm. originally purchased with Sunday School offerings. These offerings were initially slated for charity.

2. The progress on reimbursement of funds for the youth Puerto Rico trip is still ongoing. The credit limit on the church credit card was not high enough to pay for airline tickets, therefore Pastor Craig had to use his own personal credit card for that purchase. He plans to pay back the church when that refund comes through. There is also some refund expected from the Youth Works Organization. Discussion included asking for higher credit limit on the church credit card to prevent this problem.

3. We were informed The Arizona Children's Star Program is no longer in existence. The \$2000 check donated from White Burro income, <u>given SPECIFICALLY to THAT program</u>, was already deposited. Steve asked for council's direction. Jim made motion for Steve to draft a letter to formally retrieve these funds from Arizona Children's Organization. Colleen seconded. Council agreed that the \$2000 donation from the White Burro Sale income needs to be returned to the church.

4. Steve explained that Lennie Hawkins was asked to buy flower arrangements to use at the tables when refreshments are served for memorial services. He expects to get a reimbursement form for this expense, yet no one asked for this to be included in the budget. **People need to be reminded if they expect to be paid back for something they purchased for the church, those funds need to be requested when the annual budget is prepared.**

E. <u>Coffee with Council feedback</u>: Shelly reported 1 person shared concerns over the offering income reported in the bulletins each weekend isn't always accurate.

F. <u>Consent Agenda</u>: Property, Pastor, and PGE were reports submitted for July. Colleen made motion to approve consent agenda and Shelly seconded. Passed.

III. Unfinished Business:

- Columbarium Board did not submit a formal request to the council for expansion. Fund Raising will not continue for that specific project at this time.
- Mike Flesher will speak to Worship Board when they meet in August about youth participation in services and adding some background info for readings at services. Jim reported the Synod Assembly convention was very interesting. He learned there are 7 small Lutheran churches in Guadalajara, Mexico.
- Jim apologized for not scheduling an orientation for new council members after the election in May. He said he is available to answer any questions any time. Evaluation of our procedures is needed to eliminate the dilemma of how to have orientation before people start leaving on vacation.

IV. New Business: NONE

Adjourn: Mary made motion to adjourn and Shelly seconded. Meeting adjourned with Lord's Prayer at 8PM
