

The symbolism of the Luther rose goes back to the 1520s. Luther explained that the red heart with the black cross at the center should remind us that the righteous live by faith in Christ the Crucified. The heart rests on a white rose to show that faith gives joy, comfort and peace. The rose is white, not red, because white is the color of heavenly spirits and angels. The white rose stands in a field of blue, the color of heaven, to show that joy in the spirit and in faith in this life is only the beginning of future heavenly joy. Surrounding the sky-blue field is a gold ring to show that happiness and joy in heaven has no end but lasts forever, just as gold is the highest, most noble and precious metal.

It is always interesting to hear the back-story of someone's decision to take the training to be a Stephen Minister. Each has his/her own reason(s), their own expectations, and their hopes for this ministry.

While I (Beverly Sandness) was preparing to retire from my principalship, along with the financial research, I was praying for guidance on how to use my God given gifts in retirement. One Sunday, Ray and I, on the way to worship, made a split second decision to attend a service at another church. During the service, the congregation commissioned a group of Stephen Ministers. I had never heard of Stephen Ministry. The following week, I did some research and was impressed; it was a distinctively Christian Care-Giving Ministry. I continued to pray to know God's will for my retirement. Fast-forward three years to when I get an early morning call asking if I would consider taking the training to be a Stephen Minister. After several weeks, I finally filled out the application and was interviewed by two Stephen Leaders. By now, I was in a fulltime "retirement" job which required traveling and could not see how I could fulfill the required twenty-plus weekly training sessions.

I was welcomed to the Stephen Ministry training and was on my transforming journey. The class marked the beginning of a new partnership in the gospel. As Paul stated in Philippians 1:4-6: *God is beginning another of his good works in you today, and you can be confident that he will carry it to completion.* I never had to miss a training session and never had to miss a professional travel responsibility.

Each of my caring relationships has been unique. I have been with a lady who was going through a divorce. I walked the journey with another lady who lost her husband to cancer. Most recently my care receiver shared her journey to her heavenly home. Other caring relationships involved life crises and difficult life transitions. At times, my care receiver felt overwhelmed by her crisis and I found myself hurting right along with the care receiver. But I counted on God's presence, His guidance and the support of our Stephen Minister Supervision Group to continue the caring. Most of all, it required my commitment and my faith in God. (God is the Cure-Giver and I am the Care-Giver.)

I am so thankful and have been so blessed by following the Holy Spirit's ever-present direction. Eleven years later I am still excited about what God has done in, among, and through the Stephen Ministry program. Council Meeting Minutes
May 21, 2019

I. Call to Order

Steve Philo called to order the regular meeting of the Mount Olive Lutheran Church Council at 7:00 pm on May 21, 2019 at the Parish Center.

II. In Attendance: Steve Philo, Larry Schneider, Susan Leifer, Pastor Craig, Patrick Barney, Amy Conway, Jim Day, Alice Hayes, Leslie Hollman, Tony Morbeto, Josh Sondrol

III. Devotions and Opening Prayer: Pastor Craig led us in the opening prayer. Alice Hayes provided devotions.

IV. Additions to the Agenda: Steve Philo called for any additions to the agenda. Amazon SMILE was brought from the floor as an addition to Old Business. Larry Schneider moved to accept the addition. Alice Hayes seconded. Motion carried.

V. Minutes from the Last Meeting: Patrick Barney motioned to approve the minutes from the last meeting. Tony Morbeto seconded. After a discussion of minor typos, the motion carried.

VI. Correspondence: We received a letter of thanks and a certificate of appreciation from the AZ Children's Association.

VII. Financials: Steve Philo presented the reports for the month of April and reports for YTD April 2019. Items noted: (1). Donations for altar flowers are in the red, and there are still a number of Sundays that remain open. (2.) The amount of offerings coming in to the Building Fund for our monthly mortgage is running between \$200 and \$300 below our payment. Larry Schneider moved to approve the April financials. Josh Sondrol seconded. Motion carried.

VIII. Consent Agenda: The Pastor's Report was pulled from the Consent Agenda to allow for further discussion. Larry Schneider moved to accept. Amy Conway seconded. Motion carried.

IX. Old Business:

- a) The Youth Education Scholarship (YES) fund is not being fully utilized. Its purpose is to provide college scholarships for graduating high school seniors who have been actively involved in the church OR to provide a scholarship for a church member attending Seminary. A discussion ensued as to whether we could broaden the criteria/purpose of the fund to include Seminary candidates within our region of the ELCA. Because named members of Mount Olive gave to the fund specifically for scholarships for members only, Amy Conway and Jim Day will contact the individuals to find out if some of their donations could be transferred to a newly created Seminary fund. This fund would be for both members of Mount Olive and individuals who are part of our region of the ELCA. Susan Leifer motioned to accept the establishment of a separate Seminary Fund. Larry Schneider seconded. After more discussion, the motion carried.
- b) Smith's no longer accepts VISA credit cards for food and gasoline. All church credit cards are VISA cards. Suggestions made were (a.) go to Albertson's or (b.) look in to obtaining a Master Card. The benefit of obtaining a Master Card is that Pastor Craig can purchase Smith's gift cards in advance to give to individuals in need. They can buy gas AND food at Smith's.
- c) Susan Leifer presented options for ready-made cabinets to install in the space to the back of the choir room. The best alternative would be to have custom cabinets made to accommodate the various needs/sizes of space for storing items. Jim Day said he would ask the wood shop if they would be willing to work with the property board in the specifications and building of the cabinets.
- d) Amazon SMILE is a program whereby 1/2% of the purchases of registered members could be donated to Mount Olive. Discussion followed. Steve Philo will look in to what additional steps are needed to implement the program.
- e) Pastor's Report: The transition of the Office Administrator position is going very well. The small office across from the women's restroom is now designated as Jenifer Clark's office. Any groups normally meeting in that space can meet in the Sunday School snack room instead. June 9 has been designated as first communion Sunday for 9 youth. On June 23, Pastor anticipates that 7 adults and 10 children will be installed as new members. The new member luncheon will follow for new members, their sponsors and Council. Jim Day moved to accept the Pastor's report. Alice Hayes seconded. Motion carried.

X. New Business:

- a) Sign-ups for monthly meeting devotions and Coffee with Council were sent around to members.
- b) Discussions took place regarding whether or not liaisons to committees and ministries had voting rights.
- c) Western Safe & Lock needs a list of persons authorized to have copies of church keys made. Pastor Craig, Colleen Klatt and Larry Schneider were names brought to the floor.
